



YOUR INVESTMENT IN THE LAKE SIMCOE WATERSHED

The Lake Simcoe Conservation Foundation is committed to restoring the environmental health of Lake Simcoe and the land that supports the lake. Your support for the foundation is an investment that nurtures the watershed's natural resources, creates understanding of nature's own processes and provides moments of joy in the process.

Stewardship Projects

Across the watershed we provided more than \$265,000 to initiate projects to protect and restore the natural functions of rivers, streams and wetlands. Our investment, when matched with funds from public and private partnerships, accomplished work totalling more than \$1.3 million! Every dollar invested with us gained almost four more to make an even greater impact on the health of the watershed.

To make the most of our investment in the lake's health we continued to focus on the single biggest contributor of phosphorus pollution to the lake – the East Holland River. Along the course of the river and in its watershed we funded 42 projects.

Scanlon Creek Conservation Area Education Programs

Our children are our future. To increase their understanding of our environment we funded redevelopment of the educational curriculum to make it more relevant – our bird banding program was established and is very popular with students. Then to increase the program's reach we worked with local shelters and subsidized 10 children to attend summer camp at Sheppard's Bush in Aurora. We funded a new outdoor learning concept in the design of an outdoor discovery play garden for children which will begin construction fall 2010. Adults will appreciate the upgrades to hiking trails and picnic pavilions. And mans best friends will also be included when the off-leash dog park is unveiled in summer 2010.

Showcase Videos

After the first seven Showcase videos in 2008 created some excitement, the Foundation chose to fund another eight videos in 2009. Interviews of project designers and supporters and footage of stewardship projects with before and after shots give a "behind the scenes" exposé of how the conservation authority's projects work to help Lake Simcoe.
